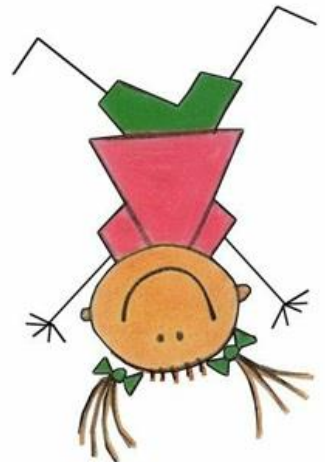
You do not have to have logoed items, but if you wish to purchase them they can be ordered via Gascoigne Clothing, a family run business based in Leicestershire.

What your child will need to bring (settling in sessions)

- Water bottle (with water only please)
- Bag (with spare clothes in case of accidents)
- Please make sure ALL items are named with your child's name



What your child will need to bring (once they start)

- Water bottle (with water only please)
- Bookbag/school bag (please bring every day!)
- Lunchbox (if having packed lunch)
- Wellies and waterproof coat and trousers to be kept at school
- Spare clothes to keep at school in case of accidents
- Coat/all in one- we go out in all weathers!
- Healthy Snack -We have fresh fruit for the children to help themselves to but if you would like to bring an additional piece of fruit or plain biscuit (**no chocolate!**)
- **Please make sure ALL items are named with your child's name**
- It is also important that your child knows what their coat/water bottle/shoes/lunchbox looks like!



New Early Years Foundation Stage Framework 2021

- More time for staff to interact with the children.
- Long, uninterrupted periods of time to play indoors and outside where the children can become deeply involved in their learning. This is how young children learn best.

A typical day in Reception

8:40	Please wait in the playground outside the Reception Base.
8:45	Children come into school, hang up their coat, put away their water bottle and snack from home, self register and choose their lunch.
9.00	Phonics session (initially this will only be a few minutes)
9.30	Continuous Provision- Children have access to the indoor and outdoor areas. We encourage the children to choose it, use it, put it away.
11.20	Maths session (initially this will only be a few minutes)
11.55	Lunch
1.10	One of : PSED/Understanding the world/Music/Forest School/Expressive Arts and Design
1.30	Continuous Provision- Children have access to the indoor and outdoor areas. We encourage the children to choose it, use it, put it away
2.45	Storytime and Songs
3.15	Hometime- Please wait in the playground outside the Reception base.



Provision



PE

- We will have PE once a week. We will let you know which day this will be as soon as we know.
- Come to school in PE kit on PE days
- Velcro fastenings please!



Breakfast and After school club

- Breakfast club is available from 7:45am each day
- After school club is available until 6pm
- Both clubs offer refreshments for the children
- We accept childcare vouchers and are registered for the government tax free childcare scheme.
- You can book your session via Arbor. Sessions must be paid for at the time of booking.

Drop off and pick up

- Reception school times are 8:45am- 3:15pm
- When you come to school in the morning, please wait in the playground outside the office.
- The children will come in when one of the members of staff opens the door to greet them.
- If you are not able to pick your child up at the end of the day, please advise us or the office in advance who is to collect.
- Please also let us know if they are attending our after school club or castle lane after school club.



Illness

- If your child is ill please telephone the school office and leave a message on the answerphone in the morning.
- Any child with sickness or diarrhoea must not return to school for at least 48 hours after the last episode.
- Please make sure we have up to date contact details in case your child is ill at school and we need to contact you.



Pupil premium

- Pupil Premium funding, which is received by the school annually, is used to improve pupil attainment and to help overcome any barriers to learning in order to close the gap and give pupils the very best chance to go on to be successful learners later in life.
- Qualification for this funding is dependent on a number of things – if you would like any further information or think that your child might qualify, please do contact the school office and let us know.



Getting ready for school

The more that your child can do by themselves, the more confident and ready to learn they will be.

Children should be able to:

- Walk distances confidently and not be in a pushchair or carried any more.
- Recognise their coat, shoes and wellies and put these on/take them off and fasten them.
- Take themselves to the toilet, wipe themselves and wash their hands.
- Sit and listen to a story and sing a range of nursery rhymes.
- Use a knife and fork to eat.
- Eat whole pieces of fruit.
- Tidy up their belongings and toys.
